COMMUNITY COLLEGE OPPORTUNITY GRANTS

New Jersey's FY 2019 budget appropriated funding for the first phase of the Community College Opportunity Grant (CCOG) program. For the Spring semester of 2019, the CCOG program is being piloted at 13 community colleges across New Jersey.

CCOG provides last-dollar scholarships to students enrolled in at least six credits at pilot colleges during the Spring semester of 2019. These CCOG awards will pay the costs of tuition and approved educational fees that are not already covered by other available grant funds applied to the student's account. During this initial pilot phase of the program, CCOG awards are limited to students whose adjusted gross income is between \$0 and \$45,000.

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NEW JERSEY STARS

High school students who graduate in the top 15 percent of their class can earn full tuition scholarships to attend community colleges through the New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Rewards Scholarship (NJ STARS). In Fall 2016, over 2,200 NJ STARS students attended community colleges.

WORKFORCE TRAINING

Community colleges provide statewide training services through the New Jersey Community College Consortium for Workforce and Economic Development. Since its inception, the Consortium has trained over 240,000 employees at over 10,000 companies throughout New Jersey.

DID YOU KNOW?

Community colleges are the largest provider of higher education in New Jersey, enrolling over 325,000 students annually.

Forty-five percent of all students who earned a bachelor's degree from a New Jersey college or university had previously completed courses at a community college.

Students who complete their first two years at a New Jersey community college before transferring to a four-year school save \$21,000 in tuition – the most in the country.


New Jersey community college students do very well when they transfer – fifth best among the 50 states in completing their bachelor's degree.

About half of the good jobs in New Jersey do not require a bachelor's degree – the second highest in the country. Community colleges make these opportunities available through career-technical programs.
